Overview of the Program

Chiba Municipal Inage Senior High School started this program in 1990, when the Intercultural Course was established, hoping that the participants could achieve the linguistic, intercultural and behavioral goals through three days of English only activities outside school. It was held either in Choshi, Nosaka or Nihon Aerobic Center every summer until 2004.

The camp site and time were switched, however, from Chiba to Fukushima, from summer to winter in the 2005 school year because British Hills was expected to provide us with a more authentic atmosphere of speaking English and of learning British culture. BH is a well-equipped facility that enables us to be immersed in English.

When we look at the history of the camp, it has a tradition of twenty consecutive years from its start including five years of visiting BH. We hope participants have fun learning English and British culture just as our great precursors did.

The 9 Principles of the Camp

The following mottoes have been passed down to partakers for many years. Try to observe them to make the camp fruitful and successful.

1. Don't speak any Japanese to other participants!
2. Be punctual!
3. Be polite!
4. Have passion: be positive, don't be negative.
5. Co-operate and communicate with others to deepen mutual understanding.
6. Speech is golden. It doesn't matter if you make mistakes.
7. After eleven o'clock, stay in your room and be quiet.
8. No one is permitted to read Japanese books.
9. This camp is your camp; if you want to get something from it, give something to it.
